And second, to recognise and strengthen diversity in every deaf community globally, including children, youth, senior citizens, women, LGTB people, deaf people with disabilities, deafblind people and CODAs, whether in developed or developing countries, and to continue working together in the areas of sign language, deaf studies, education, employment, accessibility, technology, health and bioethics.

Of course this is a call to continue our important work to achieve equality for deaf people based on the international treaty, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

I would like to take this opportunity to encourage you all to start making your travel plans for 2015 so that we can all come together to create an unforgettable experience – and naturally also so that you can visit Turkey, one of the most beautiful countries in the world!

As you know, Istanbul/Turkey is waiting for the 17th World Congress for the Deaf because Turkey was entitled to host this year's Congress, in the previous one organized in South Africa, in 2011. From my point of view, the 17th World Congress is of crucial importance for the deaf..

Although sign language was officially recognized in Turkey, there are still a lot of significant problems in the field of education. Despite the recognition of this language, the activities to put it into practice are advancing very slowly. In addition, the strides made about the social lives of the deaf people in Turkey are very slow, too. Though we, as the Turkish National Federation of the Deaf (TNFD), have warned the government several times about these matters and received such answers as "You're right, we will resolve this issue.", there is no concrete solution in our hands. We indicate that there good examples about deaf people in the world, as well bad ones, however we want to be a developing and reforming country in this regard. We aim that when the deaf people from all around the world come to our country, the Turkish Government and Turkish nation could see the good examples and how they have surmounted the difficulties in education, how they developed their social lives and thus they distinguish the differences of the deaf culture and change their old fallacies at the same time. We hope to achieve this.

Having an outstanding 8.000-year history, İstanbul is a city which has hosted diverse cultures. I hope that all the deaf people coming from all around the world will be delighted to see this beautiful city.

We continue our activities with the head and the members of Executive Board for the World Federation of the Deaf (WFD) and we receive very important support from them. Recently, we have attended a meeting at the Ministry of Family and Social Policies of the Turkish Republic. Indicating that the area of activity of the Ministry are in paralel with the subjects that World Congress handles, we asked for assistance and support for this Congress. Our dear Minister Fatma ŞAHİN agreed and we came to a common ground on all subjects. For this reason, we are very contented that WFD is provided a firm support in this regard.

We are aware that similar problems exist in many countries in the world, as in Turkey. We hope that this World Congress that will be organized in Turkey, as the host country of this year, will contribute positively to the lives of all deaf people in the world. We become aware of the problems of these people through our dialogues with various countries and associations besides the information that the WFD provides us. We want that Turkey hosts this transformation process.

The UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities was approved by our country as a signatory state and passed from the parliament, but we rarely see related implementations in this regard. The implementations are generally aimed for people with physical disabilities or people who are visually impaired. So, what about "the Deaf"?

Are the lives and education of the deaf people considered as a problem? Then, alright; the World Congress is the place where we can find solutions to these problems. We have reached a consensus with the government about this issue. I here let you know that we have initiated the activities for the Congress and we have opened our web-site. You can find information on our web-site about the history of Istanbul, other information about the city, contact details about the Congress and how you can enrol in the Congress. I hereby want to say welcome to you all and wish that all the deaf people and all the countries around world participate in this Congress.

Because Turkey is in the middle of the world, in other words, if we metaphorically liken the world to human body, Turkey is the center point of this body. The air transport provides easy access to Turkey; it is also easy to access both in terms of inner city and inland transportations.

We would like to see that all the deaf people around the world visit Turkey. We want that all the world countries support us with their participation, as WFD does. With your contributions, the lives of the dead people in Turkey will experience a positive transformation. I hope that the rate of participation in the Congress will be high.

The Congress is significant because various matters ranging from the education to the lives of the deaf, from the situation of deaf women to the promotion of sign language will be brought to the forefront in the Congress programme.

I invite all deaf people around the world to this grand organization. Thank you for your attention.
